



Delco Pen Pals

Interested in writing to a new friend? Anyone entering 1st through 6th grade can be a part of our Delco Pen Pals.

Here's how:

Pick up the Delco Pen Pal packet at your local Delaware County library.

Return your first letter and registration packet to your librarian. Once you've been given a pen pal, all other letters can be put in the Pen Pal mailbox to be delivered. Check back often to see if you have a letter.

Pen Pals who write two letters are invited to join the libraries for a party at Rose Tree Park on August 7th from 1:00-3:00 pm.

All kids going into grades 1st-6th are welcome to participate.



Pen Pal registrations will be accepted June 1st-July 15th
Letter delivery will be ongoing until August 30th

How do you do it?

1. Fill out the Pen Pal information sheet attached.
2. Fill out the All About Me sheet attached.
3. Write your first letter (address it to: Dear Pen Pal) and tell your Pen Pal something special you hope to do this summer.
4. Decorate an envelope and put your letter and All About Me sheet inside. Address your envelope with **To: Pen Pal and From: Your first name, first letter of your last name (example Ben S.)**
5. Submit everything to your librarian. You will be paired with a pen pal and your first letter will be delivered!
6. The library will contact you when your first letter has arrived. When you come to pick up your letter, **take some time to write back to your Pen Pal** and put that second letter in the mailbox.
7. Throughout the summer, visit your library to drop off letters for your Pen Pal and pick up letters from your Pen Pal.
8. Pen Pals who write at least two letters are invited to a Summer Quest party on August 7th from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. and may possibly meet their Pen Pal. Please RSVP to Theresa Dykes at tdykes@delcolibraries.org by August 1st with your name, home library and number in your party to receive a drawstring bag from County Council and other goodies.
9. The library will stop sending letters for you on August 30th. Feel free to write to your pen pal and let them know you would like to continue writing and include your e-mail so further information can be shared.
10. The library system will try its best to deliver letters and encourage Pen Pals to respond. Unfortunately, some Pen Pals will only receive one letter. If you have any comments about this, or the program, please e-mail ccrow@delcolibraries.org as your librarian cannot give out any additional Pen Pal information.

Pen Pal Tips:

1. Do not tell your Pen Pal where you live or your phone number without your parents' permission.
2. Ask your pen pal questions, and tell them about things you like. It can also help to answer your own questions when writing to your Pen Pal (What do you like to do? I like riding my bike and dancing.)
3. You can also draw, write stories, and add stickers to your letters.
4. Use kind words when writing to your Pen Pal.
5. Have your parents read over your letters before sending them.
6. If your Pen Pal says something you think an adult should know, tell your parents or your librarian right away.
7. Remember to write TO: your Pen Pal's first name and first letter of their last name and FROM: Your first name and first letter of your last name on the front of all your letters.
