K – 8; Principal of Kindergarten Academy; and Superintendent of Interboro School District. Before joining our school district, Lois was an elementary teacher, guidance counselor, and assistant principal in the Upper Darby School District. One of the highlights of Lois's many accomplishments at Interboro was the development of the full-day kindergarten program, which was recognized as one of six model sites for early childhood education across the state.

Evidence of Lois's dedication to non-profit work is her service as Board Member of the Franklin Mint Federal Credit Union Education Foundation and as Vice President of the Delaware County Literacy Council.

Following her retirement from Interboro, she was President of The Edward Joseph Snyder Family Support Center/OrganizED Giving; President of the Board of Directors of Family and Community Services of Delaware County; and a member of DKG, an international society of educators supporting women in education.
