#### **RE:** First Trimester and First Quarter Marking Period

Hello, Families,

As you may be preparing to attend your child's conference next week, we want to provide you with an update on what information and reporting will be shared with you, as the reports provided may look a bit different due to the recent network disruption.

#### **Elementary**

- 1. <u>**PreK Families**</u> will receive the social-emotional and early numeracy/literacy form developed and completed by teachers.
- 2. <u>K-2 Families</u> will receive the Characteristics of Learning document typically found on the Standards-Based Report Card that has been manually completed by the teacher, Acadience brochure, Acadience Fa mily Reports (Math and ELA), and special education progress monitoring (when applicable)
- <u>3-5 Families</u> will receive the Characteristics of Learning document typically found on the Standards-Based Report Card that has been manually completed by the homeroom teacher, Acadience brochure, Acadience Family Report (ELA); Spring Math Report (Math); special education progress monitoring (when applicable)

For grades K-5, the above documentation will replace the first trimester standards-based report card. We will plan to continue standards-based reporting for grades K-5 at the end of the second trimester.

If families do not attend conferences, homeroom teachers will distribute the child's reports on Monday, December  $2^{nd}$  for the student to take home.

#### **Secondary**

 $6^{th}$  grade Families – will receive the Acadience brochure and the Acadience Family Report (ELA). If families do not attend conferences, the Acadience information will be distributed on Monday, December  $2^{nd}$  for the student to take home.

For  $6^{th} - 12^{th}$  grade families attending conferences, the teacher will print the child's individual grade report for their respective class from Schoology. Special education progress monitoring (when applicable) will also be discussed with the family. When the network issues are resolved, we will follow up with the dates for the first marking period reporting.

For special education students in grades 1-12, progress reports will be sent home (emailed) or given at conferences.
