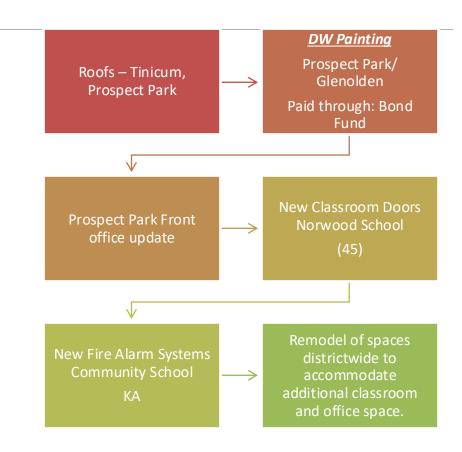

# CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS



### WHAT'S HAPPENING IN HARRISBURG.... UPDATE ON THE STATE BUDGET

Proposed General Fund Expenditures are \$48.3 billion of which \$19 billion is set aside for education.

### Proposed K-12 Education Funding:

- \$8.9 billion in Basic Education Funding; increase of \$1.072 billion
- \$1.4 billion in Special Education Funding; increase of \$50 million
- \$50 million increase for PCCD school safety grant
- \$100 million increase in mental health funding
- \$30 million increase for Pre-K Counts
- Dual enrollment projects, social security & retirement reimbursements and transportation subsidies under the current proposal will remain the same as 2023-2024

#### Newish Appropriations:

- \$8,000 per student proposed for cyber charter tuition (a potential of \$262 million back to the school districts.
- \$300 million proposed for school environmental repairs & improvements grants
